

## NINETY-FIRST SESSION

***In re Sokolov (No. 3)***  
**(Application for review)**

**Judgment No. 2078**

The Administrative Tribunal,

Considering the application filed by Mr Dmitri Konstantinovich Sokolov on 25 September 2000 for review of Judgments 1940 and 1999;

Considering Article II, paragraph 5, of the Statute of the Tribunal and Article 7 of its Rules;

Having examined the written submissions;

### CONSIDERATIONS

1. By Judgment 1999 delivered on 12 July 2000 the Tribunal dismissed as being clearly irreceivable a first application by the complainant for review of Judgment 1940. In the present application he seeks review of both judgments.
2. Judgments of the Tribunal carry the authority of *res judicata* and may be reviewed only in exceptional cases and on very limited grounds (Judgment 442, *in re de Villegas* No. 4).
3. The complainant has advanced no admissible grounds warranting review of either judgment. His plea is unsubstantiated and therefore clearly irreceivable. The Tribunal dismisses his application in accordance with the summary procedure set out in Article 7 of its Rules.

### DECISION

For the above reasons,

The application is dismissed.
