

The Administrative Tribunal,

Considering the third application for review of Judgment 1484, filed by Mr P. T.-C. on 24 June 2006;

Considering Article II, paragraph 5, of the Statute of the Tribunal and Article 7 of its Rules;

Having examined the written submissions;

CONSIDERATIONS

1. The complainant has submitted a third application for review of Judgment 1484, in which the Tribunal set aside a decision of the Director-General of the World Health Organization (WHO) of 17 May 1994 confirming a decision to end the complainant's appointment and ordered the Organization to pay him damages equal to the salary that he would have earned had his appointment been maintained until the end of his contract.

2. In support of this third application for review, the complainant contends that his dismissal was unlawful and unjustified and that he should have been reassigned to a post better adapted to his capabilities. He considers that in view of the Administration's mistakes and the uncertainty of his personal situation, he is entitled inter alia to the payment of an assistant's salary from the date of his dismissal and to compensation in the amount of 500,000 euros.

3. As it found in Judgments 2166 and 2265 dismissing the complainant's previous applications for review, the Tribunal considers that his pleas and claims clearly do not constitute admissible grounds for reviewing the contested judgment. The application is therefore dismissed in accordance with the summary procedure provided for in Article 7 of the Rules of the Tribunal.

DECISION

For the above reasons,

The application is dismissed.
