# In re BONNEAU (No. 3)

(Application for interpretation)

## **Judgment 815**

THE ADMINISTRATIVE TRIBUNAL,

Considering the application filed by Mr. Daniel Maurice Bonneau on I September 1986 for interpretation of Judgment 757, the reply filed by the International Labour Organisation (ILO) on 20 October, the complainant's rejoinder of 9 November and the Organisation's surrejoinder of 9 December 1986;

Considering Article II, paragraph 1, of the Statute of the Tribunal;

Having examined the written evidence;

#### CONSIDERATIONS:

The Tribunal will entertain an application for interpretation of a judgment only if the operative part is unclear or ambiguous.

The decision the complainant impugned in his complaint was in two parts. The Tribunal quashed it insofar as it imposed a disciplinary sanction on him and it dismissed his other claims. The operative part is quite plain: in quashing the decision the Tribunal neither altered nor sought to alter the part of it which related to the ILO's withholding some of the complainant's entitlements. There being no grounds for interpreting the judgment, the application fails.

## **DECISION:**

For the above reasons,

The application for interpretation is dismissed.
