

ALGERIA

Region: Africa

Income group: Upper-middle income

Summary: Algeria has reported 4 metadata sources, which collect information on international migration statistics. There are two census based sources such as the *General Census of Population and Housing* and *Economic Census*, which are carried out by the National Statistics Office. There are also two administrative records, such as *Trans-boundary Movement Statistics* carried out by the DGNS and *Register of the Ministry of Labour and Employment* held by the Directorate-General for Employment and Integration - Directorate for Employment Regulation.

Geographically the sources cover whole country, however different population groups, such as:

- *Nationals (citizens) in the country (covered by the General Census of Population and Housing),*
- *Nationals (citizens) employed in the country (covered by the General Census of Population and Housing),*
- *Foreigners (non-citizens) living in the country (covered by the General Census of Population and Housing),*
- *Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country (covered by the General Census of Population and Housing and the Register in the Ministry of Labour and Employment),*
- *Entry nationals returning from residence abroad (covered by the Trans-boundary Movement Statistics),*
- *Exit nationals going abroad to live (covered by the Trans-boundary Movement Statistics),*
- *Exit nationals leaving for temporary purposes such as for tourism, shopping, visiting, business, etc. (covered by the Trans-boundary Movement Statistics),*
- *Foreigners entering country to live (covered by the Trans-boundary Movement Statistics),*
- *Foreigners entering country for temporary purposes, such as tourism, shopping, visiting, business, etc. (covered by the Trans-boundary Movement Statistics), and*

Periodicity of data collection varies depending on the type of sources. The *General Census of Population and Housing* was last processed in 2008; the *Economic Census* was carried out in 2011; the *Trans-boundary Movement Statistics* is carried out continuously; the *Register of the Ministry of Labour and Employment* is monthly carried from 2011.

Age coverage also varies depending on the type of sources. The *General Census of Population and Housing* cover persons aged 5 years and older, whereas administrative records comprise population groups of all ages.

The two essential demographic characteristics covered by all the sources are age and sex. Other demographics topics such as marital status, educational attainment, and household size are available from various sources.

International migration related characteristics vary depending on the sources. Country of birth, country of citizenship, and nationality are covered in various sources. The *Trans-boundary Movement Statistics* covers country entering from, reason for coming to country, and country of destination and the *Register of the Ministry of Labour and Employment* collects year of arrival, reason for departure, nationality, foreign workers in the country, country of previous residence, time period allowed to stay, and year of departure. The *General Census of Population and Housing* asks information about household members and their characteristics who left to live, work or study abroad for the last five years.

Labour related characteristics such as employment status and occupation are generated in all the sources except to the *Economic Census*. The *General Census of Population and Housing* and the *Trans-boundary movement statistics* also cover industry/economic sector. Data on individual earnings can be found in the register.

Definitions of “*international migrant workers*”, “*short-term migrant workers*”, “*employment*”, “*individual earnings*”, “*overseas visitor*”, and “*country of residence*” are applied in the sources. Definition of “*employment*” used in the *General Census of Population and Housing* is the standard ILO definition.

To classify occupation, industry, status in employment, and education internationally adapted classifications are used in the *General Census of Population and Housing*. The *Economic Census* applies an internationally adapted classification of industry. The register uses a nationally adjusted classification of occupation.

Micro data files from the *General Census of Population and Housing* and the *Economic Census* are available for research and analysis at different costs or for free.

Findings:

The latest *General Census of Population and Housing* was processed in 2008 by the National Statistics Office covering the whole country. There are population groups examined in the Census:

- *Nationals (citizens) in the country,*
- *Nationals (citizens) employed in the country,*
- *Foreigners (non-citizens) living in the country, and*
- *Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country.*

The *General Census of Population and Housing* obtains detailed data on demographic characteristics of these population groups, such as age, sex, marital status, educational attainment, and household size. The questions on international migration related characteristics are country of birth, and country of citizenship. In addition to the characteristics, the *General Census of Population and Housing* asks information about household members who left to live, work or study abroad for the last five years, such as:

- Name,
- Month/Year of departure,
- Sex,
- Age at time of leaving household,
- Marital status at time of leaving,

- Education at time of leaving, and
- Employment status at time of leaving.

The **General Census of Population and Housing** covers labour related characteristics of all current household members aged five years and over, such as employment status, occupation, industry/economic sector, and status in employment.

"**Employment**" is a person who works or has a remunerative activity in cash or in kind at least 1 hour during the reference week. To classify occupation, industry, status in employment, and education, both internationally and nationally adapted classifications are applied. For example:

- ISCO-08;
- National adaptation of ISIC;
- National adaptation of ICSE ; and
- National adaptation of ISCED.

Micro data from the source are available for research and analysis outside the agency.

The **Border/Admission Statistics** are covered by the **Trans-boundary Movement Statistics**. The DGNS continuously collects data covering the following population groups of all ages.

- *Entry nationals returning from residence abroad,*
- *Exit nationals going abroad to live,*
- *Exit nationals leaving for temporary purposes such as for tourism, shopping, visiting, business, etc.,*
- *Foreigners entering country to live, and*
- *Foreigners entering country for temporary purposes, such as tourism, shopping, visiting, business, etc.*

The Statistics cover data on demographic characteristics such as age, sex, and marital status. Data on the following international migration related characteristics are presented through the source:

- Country of citizenship,
- Country entering from,
- Reason for coming to country, and
- Country of destination.

The source accumulates on labour related characteristics such as employment status, occupation, and industry/economic sector.

"**Overseas visitor**" refers to the entry into the national territory of a person having a nationality other than Algerian and within the framework of tourism, visit of business, missionary, etc. "**Country of residence**" is state of a person residing in a country which is not his country of origin.

Micro data are unavailable for research and analysis outside the agency.

The **Economic Census** was last carried out in 2011 by the National Statistics Office.

The statistics are collected irregularly, the last was carried out in 2011 starting from 2011, geographically covering the whole country. The Census appraises all economic establishments of any size and covers the following topics for the establishment:

- Industry/economic sector, and
- Number of employees

The questions raised in the assessment on the topic of demographic and international migration related characteristics are age, sex, country of birth, and nationality. The *Economic Census* collects status in employment for labour related characteristics. To classify industry, ISIC Rev.4 is applied in the source.

Micro data is available for research and analysis outside the agency at approximately 1.7 billion Algerian Dinars.

The record of the *Ministry of Labour and Employment Health* is carried out by the Directorate-General for Employment and Integration -Directorate for Employment Regulation every month starting from 2011. The source appraises the whole country and collects data on a population group of *foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country* of all ages.

In the register, data can be found on demographic characteristics such as age, sex, marital status, and educational attainment. International migration related characteristics accessible through the source are such as:

- Country of birth,
- Year of arrival,
- Reason for departure,
- Country of citizenship,
- Nationality,
- Foreign workers in the country,
- Country of previous residence,
- Time period allowed to stay,
- Year of departure, and
- Time period allowed to stay.

In the source, the data on labour related characteristics is available, particularly for employment status, individual earnings, and occupation.

"*International migrant workers*" refer to foreign workers who has a nationality other than Algerian nationality or who has no nationality, and is bound by an employment contract in accordance with the labour legislation in force. "*Short-term migrant workers*" comprised temporary foreign workers who are working less than 3 months. "*Employment*" covers any worker employed in the national territory. "*Individual earnings*" refer to remuneration.

To classify occupation, nationally adapted classifications are applied, such as Algerian Nomenclature of Jobs and Trades (NAME).

Micro data is unavailable for research and analysis outside the agency.
