Summary: Bahamas has reported the *Census of Population and Housing* as one metadata source, which collects information on international labour migration statistics. It is carried out by the Department Of Statistics.

Geographically the census covers whole country, and various population groups such as:

- Nationals (citizens) in the country,
- Nationals (citizens) employed in the country,
- Nationals (citizens) living abroad,
- Foreigners (non-citizens) living in the country, and
- Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country.

The *Population and Housing Census* was last processed in 2010. The five essential demographic characteristics covered by the census are age, sex, marital status, educational attainment, and household size.

International migration characteristics covered by the census are country of birth, country of citizenship, country of previous residence for foreigners, and country of previous residence for citizens who lived abroad but returned. The census asks information about household members and their characteristics who left to live, work or study abroad for the all persons who have moved abroad (to live) during 2000-2010 and are still abroad. To collect information on immigrants and return migrants, the census contains questions such as "Have you ever lived outside the country?" and "When did you arrive in this country?" and the data for the situation of the person around the time prior to leaving the household last time are obtained.

Labour related characteristics that can be found in the census include employment status, occupation, industry/economic sector, status in employment, hours usually worked, disability, individual earnings per month, and household income. It also includes questions about remittance including remittance received and reference period for remittances.

Definition of "employment" used in the census is the standard of the ILO

To classify occupation, industry, and education both internationally and nationally adapted classifications are used in the census.

Findings:

The latest *Census of Population and Housing* was processed in 2010 by the Department of Statistics, covering the whole country. There are five population groups examined in the census such as:

- Nationals (citizens) in the country,
- Nationals (citizens) employed in the country,
- Nationals (citizens) living abroad,
- Foreigners (non-citizens) living in the country, and
- Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country.

The census obtains detailed data on demographic characteristics of these population groups, such as age, sex, marital status, educational attainment, and household size. The questions raised in the assessment on the topic of international migration related characteristics are:

- Country of birth,
- Country of citizenship,
- Country of previous residence for foreigners, and
- Country of previous residence for citizens who lived abroad but returned.

In addition to the characteristics, the census asks information about household members who left to live, work or study abroad for the all persons who have moved abroad (to live) during 2000-2010 and are still abroad, such as:

- Month/Year of departure,
- Sex.
- Age at time of leaving household,
- Marital status at time of leaving,
- Education at time of leaving, and
- Occupation at time of leaving.

It covers labour related characteristics of all current household members aged 15 years and over such as:

- Employment status,
- Occupation,
- Industry/economic sector,
- Status in employment,
- Hours usually worked,
- Disability,
- Individual earnings per month, and
- Household income.

The census also includes questions about remittance including remittance received and reference period for remittances. The census contains questions, which help to collect information on immigrants and return migrants such as "Have you ever lived outside the country?" and "When did you arrive in this country?" Also the following characteristics for the situation of the person around the time prior to leaving the household last time are obtained:

- Employment status,
- Status in employment,
- Occupation, and
- Industry/Economic sector.

[&]quot;Employment" is the standard definition of the ILO. To classify occupation, industry, and education, both internationally and nationally adapted classifications are applied:

- ISCO-08 (where four digits are used to release the data);
- ISIC rev 4 (where four digits are used to release the data); and,
- National adaptation of ISCED.
