# **JERSEY**

Region: Europe and Central Asia

**Income group**: High income

**Summary**: Jersey has reported 3 metadata sources, which collect information on international labour migration statistics. There are two survey based sources such as the *Jersey Census* and *Annual Social Survey* carried out by the States of Jersey Statistics Unit and one administrative record of the *Work and Housing Registration Database* held by the Population office.

Geographically all the sources cover whole country. The statistics on the following two population groups are available only in the *Work and Housing Registration Database*:

- Nationals (citizens) employed in the country, and
- Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country.

Periodicity of data collection varies depending on the type of sources. The *Jersey Census* was last processed in 2011; the *Annual Social Survey* is carried out annually; and the *Work and Housing Registration Database* starts from 2014 and is not yet released.

In the Work and Housing Registration Database persons aged 16 years and older are recorded.

The two essential demographic characteristics such as age and sex are covered by both the *Jersey Census* and the *Work and Housing Registration Database*. Questions on marital status, educational attainment, and household size are also asked in the *Jersey Census*. In the *Annual Social Survey* the data on the characteristics cannot be found.

International migration characteristic covered by all the sources is country of birth. Other international migration statistics that can be found in the sources include foreign workers in the country, year of arrival, nationality, and time period allowed to stay.

Labour related characteristics that can be found in the two survey based sources include employment status, occupation, industry/economic sector, and hours usually worked. Data on disability and household income is also asked in the *Annual Social Survey*.

Definitions of "international migrant workers" and "employment" are applied in the census and the household survey.

To classify occupation and industry the *Jersey Census* applies internationally and nationally adapted classifications, whereas in the other sources the classifications are not used.

Micro data files from all the sources are unavailable for research and analysis outside the agency.

## **Findings:**

The latest *Jersey Census* was processed in 2011 by the States of Jersey Statistics Unit, covering the whole country. The Census obtains detailed data on demographic characteristics, such as:

- Age,
- Sex,
- Marital status,
- Educational attainment, and
- Household size.

The question raised in the assessment on the topic of international migration related characteristics is country of birth. The *Jersey Census* covers labour related characteristics of all current household members of all ages, such as:

- Employment status,
- Occupation,
- Industry/economic sector, and
- Hours usually worked.

"International migrant workers" refer to foreign-born workers. "Employment" refers to working for employer (or self-employed) in last week. To classify occupation and industry, both internationally and nationally adapted classifications are applied. For example:

- SOC 2010; and
- NACE, NAICS.

Micro data is unavailable for research and analysis outside the agency.

The *Annual Social Survey* is held annually by the States of Jersey Statistics unit. It geographically measures the whole country and statistics on the following international migration related characteristics are presented through the source:

• Country of birth, and

• Foreign workers in the country.

In the Annual Social Survey, the data on labour related characteristics is available, particularly for:

- Employment status,
- Occupation,
- Industry/economic sector,
- Household income,
- Hours usually worked, and
- Whether person has had disability.

In the source, "*international migrant workers*" refer to foreign-born workers. "*Employment*" refers to working for employer (or self-employed) in last week.

Micro data is unavailable for research and analysis outside the agency.

The *Work and Housing Registration Database* (register of names and addresses) is a register of work and housing permits (registration cards) and Social Security (For new workers and people moving house). It is carried out by the Population Office and is not yet released, starting from 2013. The source appraises whole country and collects data on the following two population groups aged 16 years and over.

- Nationals (citizens) employed in the country and
- Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country.

In the register, data can be found on demographic characteristics such as age and sex. International migration related characteristics accessible through the source are:

- Country of birth,
- Year of arrival,
- · Nationality, and
- Time period allowed to stay.

Micro data is unavailable for research and analysis outside the agency.
