Summary: Mexico has reported the *National Survey of Demographic Dynamics* as one metadata source, which collects information on international labour migration statistics from by the National Institute of Statistics and Geography.

Geographically the survey covers whole country, and various population groups such as:

- Nationals (citizens) in the country,
- Nationals (citizens) employed in the country,
- Nationals (citizens) living abroad,
- Foreigners (non-citizens) living in the country, and
- Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country.

The National Survey of Demographic Dynamics is carried out every five years starting from 1992.

In the survey persons aged 12 years and older are examined.

The five essential demographic characteristics covered by the survey are age, sex, marital status, educational attainment, and household size.

International migration characteristics covered by the survey are country of birth and household members living abroad. The survey also asks information about household members who left to live, work or study abroad, and questions about remittances received by the household from someone living abroad.

Labour migration related characteristics that can be found in the survey include employment status, status in employment, and possible benefits received from the employer such as retirement pension.

Agency adapted definitions of "nationals living abroad" and "employment" are applied in the survey.

Information necessary to classify occupation, industry, status in employment, and education is not available in the survey.

Micro data is available for research and analysis outside the agency free of charge.

Findings:

The *National Survey of Demographic Dynamics* in MEXICO commenced in 1992, and is held every five years by the National Institute of Statistics and Geography. A completed sample size of the examination is 94,422

households with 348,450 individuals. It geographically measures the whole country and amasses information on the following five population groups aged 12 years and over.

- Nationals (citizens) in the country,
- Nationals (citizens) employed in the country,
- Nationals (citizens) living abroad,
- Foreigners (non-citizens) living in the country, and
- Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country.

The Survey obtains detailed data on demographic characteristics of each person in a household, such as age, sex, marital status, educational attainment, and household size. Statistics on the international migration related characteristics presented through the source are country of birth and household members living abroad. The *National Survey of Demographic Dynamics* includes questions about remittances received by the household from someone living abroad. In addition to the characteristics, the survey asks information about household members who left to live, work or study abroad, such as:

- Name,
- Month/year of departure,
- Sex
- Main reason for leaving,
- Age at time of leaving household, and
- Whether that person had a visa or other document for legal entry into that country before moving there.

For the population groups assessed in the *National Survey of Demographic Dynamics*, the data on labour related characteristics of all current household members aged 12 years and over is available, particularly for employment status and status in employment. The survey also includes questions on possible benefits received from the employer such as retirement pension.

In the National Survey of Demographic Dynamics, "National living abroad" is

Person who, during the last five years, left the country to live in another regardless of his or her age at the time of the stay and that at the time of the interview live or not in Mexico. "*Employment*" is related to the following concepts.

- Economic activity: The set of actions that contribute to generate the supply of goods and services and that are given in a framework of transactions that suppose the consent between the parties.
- Economically Active Population: People of 12 years or older during the reference period (one week before the interview) engaged in an economic activity (occupied population) or actively seeking to do so (unoccupied population).
- Population occupied: People who worked for at least one hour a day to produce goods and services in return for monetary or in-kind remuneration or who did so without payment.
