

MONGOLIA

Region: Asia and the Pacific

Income group: Lower-middle income

Summary: Mongolia has reported 2 metadata sources, which collect information on international labour migration statistics. One is *Population and Housing Census* carried out by the NSO of Mongolia and the other is an administrative record of *the Legal Foreign Workers* held by the Employment Service, Survey, Information National Center, Ministry of Labour.

Geographically all the sources cover whole country. The statistics on the following population groups are available in the *Population and Housing Census*.

- *Nationals (citizens) in the country,*
- *Nationals (citizens) employed in the country,*
- *Nationals (citizens) living abroad,*
- *Nationals (citizens) living and working abroad,*
- *Foreigners (non-citizens) living in the country,*
- *Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country, and*
- *Non-citizens population.*

The *Population and Housing Census* was last processed in 2010 and the *Legal Foreign Workers* has been processed since 2001.

The five essential demographic characteristics covered by the census are age, sex, marital status, educational attainment, and household size.

With regard to international migration characteristics, the *Population and Housing Census* collects country of citizenship, country of previous residence for foreigners, country of previous residence for citizens who lived abroad but returned, and information of household members who left to live abroad. The *Legal Foreign Workers* covers nationality and foreign workers in the country.

Labour related characteristics such as employment status, occupation, industry/economic sector, status in employment, and disability are available in the *Population and Housing Census*.

Definition of “*employment*” is applied in the census.

To classify occupation, industry, status in employment, and education, internationally and nationally adapted classifications are used in the census and the administrative record.

Micro data files from the census are available for research and analysis outside the agency.

Findings:

The latest *Population and Housing Census* was processed in 2010 by the NSO of Mongolia, covering the whole country. There are seven population groups examined in the Census:

- *Nationals (citizens) in the country,*
- *Nationals (citizens) employed in the country,*
- *Nationals (citizens) living abroad,*
- *Nationals (citizens) living and working abroad,*
- *Foreigners (non-citizens) living in the country,*
- *Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country, and*
- *Non-citizens population.*

The Census obtains detailed data on demographic characteristics of these population groups, such as age, sex, marital status, educational attainment, and household size. The questions raised in the assessment on the topic of international migration related characteristics are country of citizenship, country of previous residence for foreigners, and country of previous residence for citizens who lived abroad but returned. In addition to the characteristics, the Census asks information about household members who left to live, work or study abroad, such as:

- Name,
- Month/year of departure,
- Sex,
- Main reason for leaving,
- Age at time of leaving household, and
- Age at present.

The *Population and Housing Census covers* labour related characteristics of all current household members aged 15 years and over, such as:

- Employment status,
- Occupation,
- Industry/economic sector,
- Status in employment, and
- Disability.

In the *Population and Housing Census*, “*employed*” is considered as a person who performed at least one hour work for pay or profit during the reference period in one of the employment status. Persons were considered as

employed if they were on extended absences from work because of illness or injury, holiday or vacation, strike or lockout, educational or training leave.

To classify occupation, industry, status in employment, and education, both internationally and nationally adapted classifications are applied. For example:

- ISCO-08 (where four digits are used to release the data);
- ISIC Rev 4 (where four digits are used to release the data);
- National adaptation of ICSE; and
- ISCED-1997.

Micro data are available for research and analysis outside the agency.

The *Legal Foreign Workers* is a register of work permits issued to foreign workers, which is carried out by the Employment Service, Survey, Information National Center, Ministry of Labour from 2001. In the register, data are not found on demographic characteristics and labour related characteristics, whereas some migration related characteristics such as nationality and foreign workers in the country are available.

To classify occupation, industry, status in employment, and education, internationally adapted classifications are applied. For example:

- ISCO-08 (where four digits are used to release the data);
- ISIC rev 4 (where four digits are used to release the data);
- ICSE-1993; and
- ISCED-F 2013.

Micro data are unavailable for research and analysis outside the agency.
