# **PERU**

Region: Americas

**Income group**: Upper-middle income

**Summary**: Peru has reported 3 metadata sources, which collect information on international labour migration statistics. There are two survey based source such as the *National Census of Population and Housing* and the *National Household Survey* carried out by the National Institute of Statistics and Information Technology; and one administrative record of the record of *Input and Output Movement* held by the National Superintendence of Migration.

Geographically the sources cover whole country, however different population groups such as:

- Nationals (citizens) in the country (covered by the National Census of Population and Housing and the National Household Survey)
- Nationals (citizens) employed in the country (covered by the National Census of Population and Housing and the National Household Survey)
- Entry nationals returning from residence abroad (covered by the **Input and Output Movement**)
- Exit nationals going abroad to live (covered by the **Input and Output Movement**)
- Exit nationals leaving for temporary purposes such as for tourism, shopping, visiting, business, etc. (covered by the Input and Output Movement)
- Foreigners entering country to live (covered by the Input and Output Movement)
- Foreigners entering country for temporary purposes, such as tourism, shopping, visiting, business, etc. (covered by the **Input and Output Movement**)

Periodicity of data collection varies depending on the type of sources. The *National Census of Population and Housing* was last processed in 2007; the *National Household Survey* is carried out on continuously basis starting from 1995; and the *Input and Output Movement* is held monthly since 2004.

The *National Household Survey* and the record of *Input and Output Movement* are applied to persons of all ages.

The three essential demographic characteristics covered by all the sources are age, sex, and marital status. Data on educational attainment and household size also can be found in the survey based sources.

International migration characteristic covered by all the sources is country of birth. Additionally, the *National Census of Population and Housing* covers information about household members who left to live, work or study abroad; the *National Household Survey* generates country of origin; and the *Input and Output Movement* examines country of residence, country entering from, reason for departure, country of destination, and year of arrival.

Labour related characteristics such as employment status and occupation are available in all the sources. Both the survey based sources also cover status in employment and disability. Furthermore the *National Household Survey* asks questions on individual earnings per month, household income, wage or earnings rate per time period, hours usually worked, months worked in past year, whether person has had disability, and possible benefits received from the employer.

Definitions of "employment", "overseas visitor" and "country of residence" are applied in the census and administrative record.

To classify occupation and industry the sources apply internationally and nationally adapted classifications.

Micro data files from the *National Household Survey* and *the Input and Output Movement* are available for research and analysis outside the agency for free.

# Findings:

The latest *National Census of Population and Housing* was processed in 2007 by the National Institute of Statistics and Information Technology, covering the whole country. There are two population groups examined in the Census:

- Nationals (citizens) in the country, and
- Nationals (citizens) employed in the country.

The census obtains detailed data on demographic characteristics of these population groups, such as:

- Age,
- Sex,
- Marital status,
- Educational attainment, and
- Household size.

The questions raised in the assessment on the topic of international migration related characteristics are country of birth. In addition to the characteristics, the census asks information about household members who left to live, work or study abroad. The *National Census of Population and Housing* covers labour related characteristics of all current household members aged six years old and over, such as:

- Employment status,
- Occupation,
- Industry/economic sector,
- Status in employment, and
- Disability.

Micro data are unavailable for research and analysis outside the agency.

<sup>&</sup>quot;Employment" refers to persons who worked at least an hour for some payment in cash or in kind last week.

The *National Household Survey* commenced in 1995, and is held continuously by the National Institute of Statistics and Information. A completed sample size of the examination is 31,690 households. It geographically measures the whole country and amasses information on the following two population groups of all ages:

- Nationals (citizens) in the country and
- *Nationals (citizens) employed in the country.*

The survey obtains detailed data on demographic characteristics of each person in a household, such as age, sex, marital status, educational attainment, and household size. Statistics on the international migration related characteristics presented through the source are country of birth and country of origin. For the population groups assessed in the *National Household Survey*, the data on labour related characteristics of all current household members aged 14 years and over is available, particularly for:

- Employment status,
- Occupation,
- Industry/economic sector,
- Status in employment,
- Individual earnings per month,
- Household income,
- Wage or earnings rate per time period,
- Hours usually worked,
- Months worked in past year, and
- Whether person has had disability.

The survey also includes questions on the possible benefits received from the employer, such as health insurance or subsidized health care, retirement pension, subsidized housing, and beneficiaries of social programs.

To classify occupation and industry, internationally adapted classifications such as ISCO-88 and ISIC rev 4 are applied.

Micro data are available for research and analysis outside the agency free of charge.

The *Border/Admission Statistics* are covered by the *Input and Output Movement* from the National Superintendence of Migration. Data collection has been carried out monthly. It processes the following five population groups of all ages.

- Entry nationals returning from residence abroad;
- Exit nationals going abroad to live;
- Exit nationals leaving for temporary purposes such as for tourism, shopping, visiting, business, etc.;
- Foreigners entering country to live; and
- Foreigners entering country for temporary purposes, such as tourism, shopping, visiting, business, etc.

The Statistics cover data on demographic characteristics such as age, sex, and marital status. In addition, the source collects information on international migration related characteristics such as:

- Country of birth,
- Country of residence,
- Country entering from,
- Reason for departure,
- Country of destination, and
- Year of arrival.

In the *Input and Output Movement*, the data on labour related characteristics is available, particularly for employment status and occupation.

"Overseas visitor" refers to persons who travel, for a period not exceeding twelve months, from another country to a country other than where they have their habitual residence. The main reason for the visit is not to exercise an activity that is remunerated in visiting country. "Country of residence" is the country where you habitually reside.

To classify occupation and industry, both internationally and nationally adapted classifications are applied. For example:

- National coding of occupational classification; and
- ISIC Rev 4.

Micro data are available for research and analysis outside the agency.
