Income group: Low income

Summary: Togo has reported 2 metadata sources, which collect information on international labour migration statistics. These are the *General Population and Housing Census* and the *Questionnaire of the Unified Welfare Indicators Survey (QUIBB)* carried out by the National Institute of Statistics, Economics, and Demographics.

Geographically all of the sources cover whole country and the following population groups:

- Nationals (citizens) in the country (covered by the General Population and Housing Census and Questionnaire of the Unified Welfare Indicators Survey),
- Nationals (citizens) employed in the country (covered by the General Population and Housing Census and Questionnaire of the Unified Welfare Indicators Survey),,
- Nationals (citizens) living abroad (covered by the Questionnaire of the Unified Welfare Indicators Survey),
- Nationals (citizens) working living abroad (covered by the Questionnaire of the Unified Welfare Indicators Survey),
- Foreigners (non-citizens) living in the country (covered by the General Population and Housing Census).
- Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country (covered by the General Population and Housing Census),
- Refugees (covered by the General Population and Housing Census),
- Asylum seekers (covered by the General Population and Housing Census), and
- Child workers (non-citizens) in the country (covered by the Questionnaire of the Unified Welfare Indicators Survey (QUIBB)).

Periodicity of data collection varies depending on the type of source. The *General Population and Housing Census* in Togo was last processed in 2010 and the *Questionnaire of the Unified Welfare Indicators Survey (QUIBB)* is carried out every five years starting from 2006.

The General Population and Housing Census covers persons aged 6 years and older and the Questionnaire of the Unified Welfare Indicators Survey (QUIBB) obtains information on persons of all ages.

The four essential demographic characteristics covered by the sources are age, gender, educational attainment, and household size. The sources collect the data on international migration characteristics. For instance, the questions on country of birth and country of previous residence for foreigners are asked in all the surveys. The *Questionnaire of the Unified Welfare Indicators Survey (QUIBB)* accumulates information on the household members who left to live abroad for at least 12 months, covering the characteristics of these persons.

Labour related characteristics such as employment status, occupation, industry/economic sector, and status in employment are available in the all the surveys.

Definitions of "international migrant workers", "nationals living abroad", and "employment" are used in the sources.

To classify occupation, industry, status in employment, and education the surveys apply nationally adapted classifications.

Micro data from the survey are available for research and analysis outside the agency on request from the Director General.

Findings:

The latest *General Population and Housing Census* in Togo was carried out in 2010 by the National Institute of Statistics, Economics, and Demographics covering the country's entire population. There are six population groups examined in the *General Population and Housing Census*:

- Nationals (citizens) in the country,
- Nationals (citizens) employed in the country,
- Foreigners (non-citizens) living in the country,
- Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country,
- Refugees, and
- Asylum seekers.

The *General Population and Housing Census* obtains data on demographic characteristics of these population groups such as age, sex, household size, and educational attainment. The questions raised in the assessment on the topic of international migration related characteristics, comprise country of birth, country of previous residence for foreigners, and country of previous residence for citizens who lived abroad but returned.

In addition to demographic characteristics, the *General Population and Housing Census* covers labour related characteristics of all current household members aged 6 years and older such as:

- Employment status,
- Occupation,
- Industry/economic sector,
- Status in employment, and
- Disability.

"International migrant worker" is defined as foreign worker with another nationality. "Employment" is a resident of the country who has exercised a gainful activity during the 7 days that preceded the census. It also includes those who did not worked during the reference period but who once pursued an economic activity.

To classify occupation, industry, status in employment, and education, nationally adapted classifications are applied. For example:

• National adaptation of NIEMA;

- National adaptation of ISIC;
- National adaptation of ICSE; and
- National adaptation of ISCED.

Micro-data files on population groups covered by the *General Population and Housing Census* are available for research or analysis only on request from the Director General.

The *Questionnaire of the Unified Welfare Indicators Survey (QUIBB)* in Togo is carried out every five years starting from 2006 by the National Institute of Statistics, Economics, and Demographics. It geographically measures the whole country and amasses information on the following five population groups of all ages:

- Nationals (citizens) in the country,
- Nationals (citizens) employed in the country,
- Nationals (citizens) living abroad,
- Nationals (citizens) working and living abroad, and
- Child workers (non-citizens) in the country.

The *Questionnaire of the Unified Welfare Indicators Survey (QUIBB)* retrieves the data on demographic characteristics, of each person in a household such as age, sex, household size, and educational attainment. Information on international migration related characteristics comprise country of birth, country of previous residence for foreigners, members of household left to live abroad for at least 12 months, and remittances received/sent. Characteristics of the household members left to live abroad are covered in the survey and include:

- Name
- Month/year of departure,
- Sex,
- Main reason for leaving,
- Marital status at time of leaving, and
- Age at present.

The data on labour related characteristics are available, particularly for:

- Employment status,
- Occupation,
- Industry/economic sector,
- Status in employment,
- Individual earning per month,
- Household income,
- Wage or earnings rate per time period,
- · Hours usually worked, and
- Months worked in the last year.

The data files on migration are not published/disseminated as there is no need for it.

"International migrant workers" are defined as foreign workers. "National living abroad" is anyone Togolese living abroad. To classify occupation, industry, status in employment, and education, nationally adapted classifications are used such as:

- National adaptation of ISCO;
- National adaptation of ISIC;
- National adaptation of ICSE; and
- National adaptation of ISCED.

Micro data are available for research and analysis outside the agency on request from the DG.

Definition of national (citizen) living abroad: It is anyone Togolese living abroad.

Definition of employment: This concept has not been clearly defined. Rather, the underemployment is defined. It refers to people aged 15 to 64, who is willing to take extra work during the four weeks following the survey.
