Income group: Low income

Summary: Uganda has reported 4 metadata sources, which collect information on international labour migration statistics. There are two survey based sources such as the *Uganda National Population and Housing Census* and the *National Labour Force Survey*, which are carried out by the Uganda Bureau of Statistics. There are also two administrative records, such as the statistics of the *International Migration* held by the Uganda Bureau of Statistics and a register of *Employment Services* carried out by the Ministry of Gender, Labour and Social Development.

Geographically all of the sources cover whole country, however different population groups such as:

- Nationals (citizens) in the country (covered by the **Uganda National Population and Housing Census**, the **National Labour Force Survey**, and the register of **Employment Services**),
- Nationals (citizens) employed in the country (covered by the **Uganda National Population and Housing Census**, the **National Labour Force Survey**, and the register of **Employment Services**),
- Foreigners (non-citizens) living in the country (covered by the **Uganda National Population and Housing Census** and the **National Labour Force Survey**),
- Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country (covered by the **Uganda National Population and Housing Census** and the **National Labour Force Survey**),
- Refugees (covered by the Uganda National Population and Housing Census),
- Entry nationals (citizens) returning to the country from residence abroad (covered by the statistics of *International Migration*),
- Exit national (citizens) going abroad to live (covered by the statistics of International Migration),
- Exit national (citizens) leaving for temporary purposes (covered by the statistics of **International Migration**),
- Foreigners (non-citizens) entering the country to live (covered by the statistics of **International Migration**),
- Foreigners (non-citizens) entering country for temporary purposes (covered by the statistics of International Migration), and
- Transit migrants (covered by the statistics of **International Migration**).

Periodicity of data collection varies depending on the type of sources: the *Uganda National Population and Housing Census* was last processed in 2014; the *National Labour Force Survey* is carried out every five years starting from 2011; the statistics of *International Migration* collect the data quarterly; the register of *Employment Services* is held on continuously basis.

Age coverage also varies depending on the type of sources. For instance, in the *Uganda National Population and Housing Census* labour related statistics are collected on persons aged 10 years and older. The *National Labour Force Survey* covers population of five years old and over. Administrative records amass the data on population groups of all ages.

Both surveys and administrative records collect the data on demographic characteristics, such as age and sex. In the *Uganda National Population and Housing Census* and the *National Labour Force Survey*, the data on marital status, educational attainment, and household size also can be found. All sources provide statistics on the international migration characteristics. Labour related characteristics are generated in the *Uganda National Population and Housing Census*, the *National Labour Force Survey*, and the register of *Employment Services*.

Nationally adapted definitions of "overseas visitors" and "country of residence" are used in the statistics of *International Migration*. The classifications used for occupation, industry, status in employment, and education

in the surveys are internationally adapted classifications. In the statistics of *International Migration* the ISCO – 88 classification is applied.

Micro data files from the surveys are not yet available for research and analysis. However after releasing the final results and anonymising the files it will be accessible free of charge.

Findings:

The latest *Uganda National Population and Housing Census* was carried out in 2014 by the Uganda Bureau of Statistics covering the country's entire population. There are five population groups examined in the *Uganda National Population and Housing Census*:

- *Nationals (citizens) in the country,*
- Nationals (citizens) employed in the country,
- Foreigners (non-citizens) living in the country, even if arrived recently,
- Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country, and
- Refugees.

The *Uganda National Population and Housing Census* obtains detailed data on demographic characteristics of these population groups. The questions raised in the assessment on the topic of international migration related characteristics, comprise of country of previous residence for foreigners, remittances received from abroad, and reference period for remittances. Statistics on labour related characteristics of all current household members aged 10 years and older are collected in the source, such as employment status and occupation.

To classify occupation, status in employment, and education in Uganda, internationally adapted classifications are applied.

- ISCO 08;
- ICSE 1993; and
- ISCED 2013.

Micro-data files on population groups covered by the *Uganda National Population and Housing Census* will be available for research and analysis after releasing the final results.

The *National Labour Force Survey* in Uganda commenced in 2011, and is held every five years by the Uganda Bureau of Statistics. A completed sample size of the examination is 6,580 households. It geographically measures the whole country and amasses information on the following four population groups aged 5 years and over:

- Nationals (citizens) in the country,
- *Nationals (citizens) employed in the country,*
- Foreigners (non-citizens) living in the country, even if arrived recently, and
- Foreign workers (non-citizens) living in the country.

The *National Labour Force Survey* retrieves the data on demographic characteristics, of each person in a household. For the population groups assessed in the survey, the data on international migration characteristics is available, particularly for:

- Country of birth,
- Country of current citizenship,
- Country of previous residence for foreigners,
- · Country of previous residence for citizens who lived abroad but returned, and
- Foreign workers in the country.

Labour related characteristics collected in the survey are:

- Employment status,
- Occupation,
- Industry/economic sector,
- Status in employment,
- Individual earnings per month,
- Wage or earnings rate per time period,
- · Hours usually worked, and
- Whether person has had disability.

The household survey questionnaire includes questions on the following possible benefits that may be received from employer:

- Retirement pension,
- Subsidized housing,
- Paid vacation,
- Free or subsidized food, and
- Paid sick leave, social security contributions.

To classify occupation, industry, status in employment, and education in Uganda, internationally adapted classifications are applied. For example:

- ISCO − 08;
- ISIC Rev 4;
- ICSE 1993; and
- ISCED 2013.

Micro data is unavailable at the moment as it was not anonymised yet. If anonymised, the data is always free of charge.

The *Border/Admission Statistics* are covered by the *International Migration* data obtained from the Uganda Bureau of Statistics. The data collection is quarterly carried out by the agency. It processes the following five population groups of all age groups:

- Entry nationals (citizens) returning from residence abroad,
- Exit nationals (citizens) leaving for temporary purposes,
- Foreigners (non-citizens) entering country to live,
- Foreigners (non-citizens) entering country for temporary purposes, and
- Transit migrants.

The statistics collects age and sex for demographic characteristics. The following migration related topics are also collected:

- Country of residence,
- Reason for departure,
- Reason for coming to country,
- Intended duration of stay,
- Country of destination,
- Country of origin, and
- Year of arrival.

"Overseas visitor" is defined as a person traveling to a country other than that of his/her usual residence for a period less than a year and whose main purpose of the trip is other than exercise a remunerated activity within the country of visit. "Country of residence" is a country where a person resides for more than one year and is his/her centre of economic interest. To classify occupation, the International Standard Classification of Occupations – 88 is applied.

The *Employment Services* is a data from private employment services collected by the Ministry of Gender, Labour and Social Development continuously. This geographically calculates the whole country. The information in the record is collected on the following two population groups of all ages:

- Nationals (citizens) living in the country, and
- Nationals (citizens) living abroad.

Demographic characteristics such as age, sex, and educational attainment are accessible through the record. The following data is available on the migration related characteristics:

- Country of birth,
- Country of citizenship,
- Year of departure,
- Reason for departure,
- Time period allowed to stay,
- Destination country,
- Employment contract details,
- Nationality,
- Previous country of residence,
- Country of origin, and
- Country of transit.

The record additionally provides labour related information, specifying occupation, industry/economic sector, and status in employment for the population group covered.
