(Geneva, 22-26 January 2001)

- 1. The Joint Maritime Commission is composed of two members appointed by the Governing Body, representing respectively the Employers' and Workers' groups of the Governing Body, 20 Shipowners' and 20 Seafarers' representatives, and is chaired by the Chairperson of the Governing Body. In accordance with article 1 of its Standing Orders, the members were nominated in 1996 by the 84th (Maritime) Session of the International Labour Conference. 1
